Ariès's greatest contribution, however, is his insistence on the histo- ricity of childhood: that childhood was not an essential condition, a constant across time, but something that changed — or, if childhood itself, bound by biologically- and psychologically-determined phases of develop- ment, is constant, then the understanding of it differed, as did the way it was experienced by both adults and children.
