Evaluations at the project or programme level are used to improve on-going operations and draw lessons from experience. Identifying successes as well as problems can help to design and manage better projects in the future.

Desk phase (phase 1) The external evaluation team analyses the logic of the project / programme on the basis of official documents. If not already included in the terms of reference, a set of evaluation questions is proposed and validated by the reference group. The team then specifies the indicators and provides partial answers to the questions on the basis of existing information.
